Do What Jesus Did

A couple of months ago, I had the opportunity to help lead one of our congregations in a retreat seeking to discern God's vision for their future. We had a wonderful time as we pursued what God's dream might be for the congregation.

We discovered together that vision is the picture of God's preferred future and is critical for God's people to discern. For the consequences of our inattention to vision is dire. In the King James Version, Proverbs 29:18 reads *"Where there is no vision, the people perish."* The Christian Standard Bible translates the same verse this way: *"Without revelation, people run wild."* In other words, when we take our eyes off the picture of God's preferred future, we replace God's desires for our own... and we run wild... which ultimately leads to perishing.

With all of this in mind, we broke the big group into smaller groups of 3 and 4 people to discuss what it might look like if the congregation would become the church God desired it to be in the future. A couple of minutes into the small group discussion time, one table called me over to ask me a question: "It's easy for us to know what we want for the future of the church, but how are we supposed to know what God would want for us?"

I suggested that when we don't know what to do, we should simply start with Jesus as we meet him in the gospels. As followers of Jesus, we are invited to join Jesus in what he's doing in our community and world. And what Jesus is doing today and will do tomorrow is always consistent with what Jesus has done in the gospels. In Romans 12:1-2, Paul admonishes the church *"to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your true worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God."*

So I encourage you to ask this all important question: What would our church be like if God were in charge of everything? Kind of ironic, isn't it? Shouldn't God be "in charge"? If we take seriously that Jesus is not only savior, but also Lord, then it is time we stop pursuing what we want for our churches and start pursuing God's dream for us instead. Let's start with doing what Jesus did, joining him on his mission right where God has planted us.

 - Recommendation from Education committee for the use of \$200.00 from Education fund for miscellaneous supplies for Day Camp. After discussion amongst Council, funds could be used from the Susan Pogue Day Camp fund – no need to take from Educational Fund. Susan Pogue fund has current balance of \$418.00. Melissa is also offering to donate several items from her classroom as she packs it up. Melissa to get with Amy and Day Camp sponsors to coordinate what she can offer. Vote passes.
 - Education committee would like Council approval to distribute a flyer on the last day of camp with ILC Church information to all campers. Flyer sample was distributed to Council around table, the style is similar to what we distributed for Spaghetti Fundraiser. Vote passes.

 - Security checks / Third Party: Renee’ made motion to move forward with background checks starting with Day Camp as 1st phase. Mary Jan Jenkins seconded. Vote passes.

Copy machine: The maintenance contract for the office copy machine is up for renewal. Property and Grounds would like to end the contract with old company by giving 60 days written notice and review and start with a new company. Must provide written notice by June 15th. Renee' made a motion to allow Helen to give written notice to the old company. Sandra seconded. Vote passes.

- o Renee' will review new companies – provide reviews and costs at future council meeting and discuss new contract.

- Property and Grounds Committee comes with several recommendations as follows:

- o allow the Yoga group to use the Youth room for classes due to heat in the Church overflow area

- o purchase a gutter cover and repairs as needed for the gutter located on the South side of the Fellowship Hall. The gutter account has a little over \$2500 available for upkeep/repairs.

- o To go forward with testing/installing security cameras that have been donated. Brian Menking will coordinate the installation.

- o Move the grandfather clock into the Fellowship Hall and replace old banners/posters with new banners/posters to refresh the wall decorations at no cost to the Church.

- o Allow property and grounds to start clearing the hallway exits as recommended by church insurance company for clear exits in case of emergency. Hallways noted: youth room; Sunday school arts/crafts; women's room.

§ All recommendations pass unanimously.

g. Worship:

- *NOTE: Laurie Buegeler was not present for meeting due to family emergency.

- Her report states worship committee met Monday, April 30, 2018 to discuss music selections and order of service. She noted they discussed several complaints in the last 2 months from old and young about music selections and lack of contemporary music and too much organ music. A list of music selections was provided to Sylvia Work who stated when we get to Pentecost we will have more freedom with music. Also noted (as an actionable item) is that a few of the committee members stated that they would like to have the "order of service" changed back to the way it was in 2016. Not all members of the worship committee agreed though and it seems the committee was torn between.

- o Ruth Lindquist was in our Council meeting as a guest visitor (regarding Nominating Committee update) and spoke on behalf of being in attendance at the Worship Committee meeting. She did state that some wanted the order of service changed back to the way it was. Not everyone could stand for as long as needed with songs being back to back and the reading and creed all at the beginning of service.

§ Discussion amongst Council led to noting that majority of Council were in favor of the new order of service and our only conflict at this time is the music selection. We would recommend the music selection be played at 1/3 organ, 1/3 piano, and 1/3 cd music. (Not necessarily in that order). We felt this a good compromise to all who enjoy the music of worship. It was also noted that if you felt you could not stand for the length of time congregation members could sit for songs. This would be relayed to Laurie upon her return as Worship chairperson. Ruth made notation of this as well.

POLICY FOR PRAYER CONCERN LIST:

The prayer concern list has been an important addition to our ministry and worship here at Immanuel Lutheran. The length of the list should not bother us, but what does become a problem is after someone is on the list, just how long should they be kept on the list, and who decides. We are setting up a new policy concerning that issue.

When someone is placed on the prayer concern list that is printed in the bulletin, they will be on for ONE MONTH unless the person putting them on the list designates a shorter time. If you want someone to stay on the list longer than that, you will need to call in each month and place them on the list again.

Everyone needs prayers. It is true. We could use the membership list as a prayer concern list, or even the telephone book, and be praying for people who need our prayers. For the purposes of this printed list, we are asking that people who put names on the list remain responsible for keeping them on the list. As it is, the secretary is notified to put someone on the prayer concern list, and then she has to guess when to take them off.

From now on, the secretary will ask you how long the person is to remain on the list, the longest time will be for one month, which can be renewed each month for as long as needed. You, the person who was concerned enough to put them on the list in the first place, will be the one responsible for renewing them on the list, not the secretary.
